Andrew Sheng is one of Asia's leading economics commentators, with a particular expertise on the banking system and financial systems. He is Chief Adviser to the China Banking Regulatory Commission and served as Chairman of the Hong Kong Securities and Futures Commission from 1998 to 2005.

Mr Sheng was the Deputy Chief Executive of the Hong Kong Monetary Authority from 1993 to 1998, responsible for the Reserves Management and External Departments. Previously, Mr Sheng worked with the Financial Sector Development Department of The World Bank in Washington, DC., and held various positions at Bank Negara Malaysia, the Central Bank of Malaysia, including chief economist and assistant governor in charge of bank and insurance regulation. From 2003-2005, Mr Sheng was the chairman of the International Organisation of Securities Commissions' Technical Committee.

Mr Sheng is on the international advisory council of the China Investment Corporation, China Development Bank, Securities and Exchange Board of India, and on the Board of Khazanah Nasional Berhad, Malaysia's sovereign wealth fund. He writes regular columns for Project Syndicate, Caijing Magazine and Asia NewsNet.

Mr Sheng has served as Adjunct Professor at the Graduate School of Economics and Management, Tsinghua University, Beijing, and the University of Malaya, Kuala Lumpur. He is President of the Fung Global Institute, a Hong Kong-based think tank which generates and disseminates innovative thinking and business-relevant research on global issues from Asian perspectives.
