Notification of the Ministry of Finance Exchange Control (No. 6)

By virtue of the power conferred upon him of the Ministerial Regulations on rules regarding exportation or taking out from Thailand of currency foreign currencies and negotiable monetary instruments (B.E. 2559), the Minister of Finance issues the notification as general directions as follows:

Clause 1. Any person who exports or takes out from Thailand of the following currency or foreign currencies, such person shall declare details of such currency, foreign currencies or negotiable monetary instruments to Customs Officer while passing the customs as prescribed in the annex of this notification;

(1) Currency which is currency notes or coins which their aggregate value exceeding 450,000 Baht

(2) Foreign currencies which are foreign currency notes or coins which their aggregate value exceeding US\$15,000 or its equivalent at market rate

(3) Negotiable monetary instruments where their payees are not specified and there is no restrictions on transferable of such negotiable monetary instruments as follows:

(a) Negotiable monetary instrument specifying amount of payment in Baht which its aggregate value exceeding 450,000 Baht

(b) Negotiable monetary instruments specifying amount of payment in foreign currencies which their aggregate value exceeding US\$15,000 or its equivalent at market rate

Clause 2. Any person who exports or takes out from Thailand of currencies or foreign currency or negotiable monetary instruments which their aggregate value exceeding 450,000 Baht, such persons shall declare details of such currency, foreign currencies or negotiable monetary instruments to Customs Officer while passing the customs as prescribed in the annex of this notification

Clause 3. This Notification shall come into force from the following date of its publication in the Government Gazette.
